Archiving Dance at Mark Morris Dance Group (sort of)

Qualities of the Performing Arts

- Art made manifest through action in the moment
- Potential to be recalled or restaged, but subsequent manifestations are different

Challenge for Archivists

- Limitations of the craft...We cannot (technically) archive performance!
- Institutional, cultural, and artistic need to retain the history of the performing arts

Role of performing arts archives and archivists

• Bring together all possible documentation (tangible and embodied) to create a comprehensive representation of the artform in an information infrastructure that makes sense

Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records (FRBR)

"Conceptual model for understanding the structure and relationships of bibliographic and authority records" – Lois Mai Chan, Cataloging and Classification

FRBR is broken into three groups of entities:

Group 1: consists of the products of intellectual and artistic endeavor

Group 2: comprises of those entities responsible for the intellectual or artistic content

Group 3: the subjects of intellectual or artistic endeavor (concept, object, event, and place)

FRBR Group I Entities

Work - a distinct intellectual or artistic creation
 Expression - the intellectual or artistic realization of the work
 Manifestation - the physical embodiment of an expression of a work
 Item - a single exemplar of a manifestation

Group One relationships:

a work is realized through one or more expressions
each of which is embodied in one or more manifestations
each of which is exemplified by one or more items.

FRBR and Performing Arts Archives

FRBR Group | Entities

Work - a distinct intellectual or artistic creation **Expression** - the intellectual or artistic realization of the work

Manifestation - the physical embodiment of an expression of a work

Item - a single example of a manifestation

Group 2 Entities - comprises of those entities responsible for the intellectual or artistic content

FRBR for the Performing Arts

Work - a distinct intellectual or artistic creation **Production** - a version of the work done by a particular company/artist

Performance/Event – a single event, physical embodiment of the work

Asset/Object – an object in the archive

Entities – people responsible for creating and performing the work or producing the asset


FRBR for the Mark Morris Dance Group Digital Archives

Mark Morris creates/choreographs a dance **work**the **work** is performed at an **event**, which occurs at particular time and **venue**the **event** is represented by analog and digital **objects** in the archive.

Entities create, produce, and perform **works** at **events**. They are also represented by the **objects** in the archives.


MMDG Archives FRBR Metadata Map






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The Good and Bad

Values of this model for MMDG:

- Multiple access points
- Provides space for us to record artistic and institutional knowledge
- Allows us to answer a lot of the questions that staff have about the dance company's history
 - o Ex. How many times has the dance company performed in Washington D.C.? (9 times)

Drawbacks:

- Only Collective Access (?)...
- A lot of cataloging!

Moving Forward

FRBR-Collective Access user community likely to grow in the dance archives community

Question:

Could this FRBR-ish strategy, adopted for the performing arts, be used to describe other collections?

- Yes, for the right collection
- Consider: performance as things that we do, ritualize and act upon
- Strategy offers opportunity to more intensely represent a fonds
 - Showcase the objects and the functions and events that created them
